Module 1. Policy Implementation and Program Rules

Situation

A new rule must be implemented before systems are ready.

Stakeholder pressure: Announce full implementation immediately.

Constraint: Eligibility, process, staffing, technology, and public guidance need alignment.

Module 2. Public Meetings and Stakeholder Input

Situation

Residents challenge an agency plan at a public meeting.

Stakeholder pressure: Defend the agency strongly.

Constraint: Public record, process, evidence, respect, and next steps matter.

- facilitation

Module 3. Procurement and Vendor Selection

Situation

A preferred vendor asks for early feedback before an RFP closes.

Stakeholder pressure: Give informal guidance.

Constraint: Fair competition, procurement rules, evaluation criteria, and communication limits apply.

- evaluation criteria
- bidder

- procurement rule

Module 4. Grants, Compliance, and Reporting

Situation

A subrecipient wants to reallocate funds quickly.

Stakeholder pressure: Approve by email.

Constraint: Allowability, budget category, reporting, and amendment procedures must be checked.

- allowable cost
- reporting

Module 6. Constituent Services and Escalation

Situation

A constituent demands immediate action on a permit decision.

Stakeholder pressure: Promise to fix it.

Constraint: Process status, appeal rights, agency authority, and respectful tone must be clear.

Module 7. Transparency, Records, and Ethics

Situation

A staff member receives a records request involving sensitive emails.

Stakeholder pressure: Forward everything quickly.

Constraint: Public-records rules, exemptions, review, and privacy need attention.

- conflict of interest
- ethics

Module 8. Performance Metrics and Budget Justification

Situation

A program wants budget growth despite mixed performance metrics.

Stakeholder pressure: Highlight only success stories.

Constraint: Outcomes, equity, cost, statutory mandate, and improvement plan need balanced framing.

- appropriation
- outcome measure
- equity
- public value
